Our build began in August 2017, and we're very excited to open its doors this September. The beautiful new space will accommodate four people on the main floor, complete with a full kitchen, gathering space for family visits, showers, specialized tub, and laundry facilities. The basement level includes two self-contained suites to support independent living clients.

We will welcome two new residents from existing Inclusion Selkirk homes, one from St. Amant in Winnipeg (allowing them to be closer to their family) and one who is transitioning from their family home.






### Winter Fun!
